SELECTION PROCESS

A committee of RSA Members and a representative from Creative Scotland begin by sorting through the applications. All applications should state the artist's choice of residency provider. A short list of artists will then be sent to the relevant venues for a second round of selection, which will ensure that the provider is allocated artists whom they feel meet their own aims and goals. The final decision then rests with the panel who will allocate the funds accordingly.

Artists will be awarded the residency upon having proved to the panel that the period will allow for major development and artistic exploration. The artistic management of the residency will come from the artists themselves. There is no set structure to follow – artists should manage their own day-to-day activities and are encouraged to use their time for research and development. The financial aspect will be monitored and administered by the Royal Scottish Academy. At the end of the project artists will be asked to provide a short document to assist the evaluation of the project. All resulting works/exhibitions/publications should carry RSA, Creative Scotland & Residency Centre credit/logos.

- 3. Please provide a detailed budgetary breakdown (1 page A4) of the funds required. Artists must factor in all costs from the outset and once awarded, monies to venues must be used as stated. The final decision on the amount awarded rests with the panel and they will allocate funds accordingly.
- 5. Six images or up to three Video Works (3 mins total) Images should be in the JPEG format, each image should measure approx 600 pixels along the shortest edge. Video formats accepted include: .avi/.wmv/.mov/.mpeg/.mpeg2/.mpeg4. Please caption images and provide an accompanying captions list which should include: Title (year) by Artist. Medium, dimensions and photographer credit & copyright/permission information.
